2012: Our most successful year to date

Membership is up by 36%, with 85% more standing orders and 36% more life members. All our events were well attended, with a record audience of 150 at our annual lecture on the Pre-Raphaelite Avant-Garde. People came from throughout the county: committee members had to make a dash for extra cups for the tea party, while the talk was in progress!

David Beevers led an erudite and highly engaging connoisseur's tour of the Bodley Church in November, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended. On this occasion, we also had a rare opportunity to admire, close up, the church's magnificent Burges Plate. The feast for eyes and minds was followed by a gregarious lunch in the church hall. The event was oversubscribed, with a waiting list, but David has kindly agreed to repeat the tour in March. If you missed it first time round, do book early to avoid disappointment.
